Opening Day: The Executive Mayor Cllr. Leah Mabuza Visits Empucukweni High School

The plea for extra police vehicles was made to Seriti by the SAPS due to the increase of crime within Emalahleni.


House Handover by Inayo Mining




Emalahleni Local Municipality STRATEGIC PLANNING SESSION




It was discovered that the community in Ward 23 is surrounded by illegal spaza shops ran by foreign nationals who are illegally connected to the the power supply and are selling counterfeit goods in an unhealthy and unclean environment.

The executive mayor, Cllr Leah Mabuza was part of the cut of team and noted that Emalahleni Local Municipality is losing millions of rands annually due to illegal connections within the business sector alone.

Cllr Mabuza encouraged the community of Emalahleni to approach the Municipality in order to settle unpaid bills and make arrangements to settle their debt.
